



- Delivery of specifically targeted and designed, midwifery team for Whānau Māori goal to achieve equity and encourage the achievement of best health outcomes
- Development & support the Māori midwifery workforce
- The creation and promotion of an additional option for career development for Māori midwives providing Continuity of Cares and / or Midwife Specialist
- A contribution to ADHB strategy to achieve health equity.



- Normal pregnancy, IOL PROM, EMCS fetal distress

"I was treated with respect our conversation's were very open nothing was an obstacle. Help was always given when and where needed. Considering the time we are 'inpatients' during lockdown, I was always supported by my midwives. During my labour we did experience miscommunication with other hospital staff, however our pēpī arrived safe, her pāpā was able to cut the cord and tie her muka BTW muka should be used in hospitals rather than plastic 'peg'. After the birth we were looked after and visited regularly to check on pēpi and myself, thanks team"

"Having a maori midwife for me, felt comforting and relaxing but still in a professional and confidential environment. It was much easier to relax and easier conversation about everything that I needed to do or anything that was going to happen.

I had a bit of a bleed after giving birth which was a bit scary, but my beautiful midwives and team at birthcare took care of me, made sure my baby was doing alright and let my sister be with my baby for the duration of time.

I don't really know how to explain but I feel like, maori know how to treat maori and how to take care of their own. No boundaries were crossed, my birth was totally up to me and baby girl herself and our beautiful maori midwives were there to tautoko and guide us."

"I chose to have a Māori midwife because I wanted someone who knew my culture, that understands us. It turned out that Māori Midwives were so much more! They took me on during level 4 lockdown and made me feel like whānau from the start, they also became whānau to me, leaders, gave guidance and knowledge, all in one. They kept me grounded and supported my decisions, guided me thru while letting us pave our own way. I loved this pregnancy. They never failed me. I was their first Ngā Hau birth!! They helped me deliver my beautiful son the way I wanted to. I'm coming back for my next pregnancy ladies because you tautoko Māori tikanga"
